If your files are larger than 10 MB please still complete this form and contact the IHLC (<u>ihlc@library.illinois.edu</u>) so we can make arrangements for a file transfer.

If two or more people contribute to the creation of any donated materials, or if you interview other people in the course of your documentation, we will need their permission as well. Only one person needs to submit the file and complete the submission form, but everyone who appears in the documentation or contributed to its creation needs to give their permission. Please have all appropriate individuals complete the <u>co-creator form</u> to give their permission.

Submissions will not be available to the public immediately but will be made available after materials are reviewed and processed.
